The **Summer Distance** design is suited to those students who choose to do the MDiv degree while serving in a supervised ministry setting approved by both denominational authorities and AST.

The Summer Distance MDiv consists of 15 on-campus courses that are normally taken in the summer term (3 courses per summer over 5 years) and 15 courses that are completed online.
